In a busy hospital, it was easy for the warning signs of Elaine's sepsis to be missed.

Unfortunately, this is a patient story that happens too often.

Sepsis is one of the leading causes of death in acute care settings, but it doesn't have to be. With CST, automated surveillance and alerts, based on electronic documentation, will allow for earlier identification of sepsis. And standardized guidelines embedded in the system will help care teams treat sepsis in the best way possible.
